What goes in each bin

A small act makes a big impact.

Organics

- Use for food scraps, tissues, paper towels, coffee grinds, tea bags, meat and bones.

Glass recycling

- Use for empty glass bottles and jars only (lightly rinsed).
- No broken glass.

Mixed recycling

- Use for paper, cardboard, cans, aerosols, aluminium and rigid plastics (rinsed).

General rubbish

- Use this bin only for items that can't be reused or recycled.
- Food waste no longer goes into your rubbish bin.

The way you sort your recycling and rubbish is changing from this year.

Our waste and recycling systems are changing so we can make more from your recycling and send less to landfill. With these changes, some of your recyclable materials will now be collected separately.

You will receive new collection bags that divide your waste and recycling into the following streams:

- **General rubbish**
The same transparent red bag.
- **Mixed recycling**
The same clear bag with black recycling label.
- **Glass bottles and jars**
New transparent purple bag with glass label.
- **Food waste**
The same clear bag with green organics label.

This guide gives you an overview of the changes happening. More information about what can go in each bag is available on the back of this brochure and on our website.

Make sure all bags are double knotted with no rips or tears before being stowed neatly in collection hutches. This helps to keep our resort clean and prevents spills and litter.

All waste and recycling collection dates remain the same.



How you can prepare

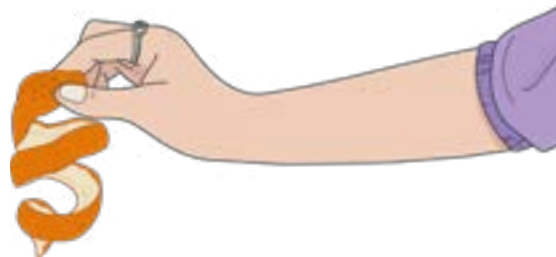
Once these changes are in effect, you must separate your waste and recycling into each new bag correctly.

You can make a start now by requesting all four bags from 4Site to be delivered to your site. Text your bag requirements and delivery address to 0437 306 799.

If you are needing free caddies or buckets to help you implement the Organics (Living Bin Program) at your site please contact FCAR directly or complete the request form online.

The FCAR Visitor Information Centre has posters, magnets, flyers available for you to help communicate the 4 stream recycling and rubbish streams to your guests.

Additionally, there are a number of digital resources that can be downloaded online, including a staff training package.



Your small acts make a big impact

It might seem like a small thing to sort your waste and recycling properly, but it makes a big impact when we all do it correctly.

Recycling well and reducing waste in the first place helps keep valuable resources out of landfill, so they can be used again and again. By sorting correctly more of your recycling than ever before can be turned into things like new glass jars, mulch and compost.

Many of Falls Creek's residents and stakeholders have been successfully diverting organic waste from landfill via the Living Bin program that began in the north-east Victorian Alpine Resorts in 2010. With these new changes everyone will now be contributing.

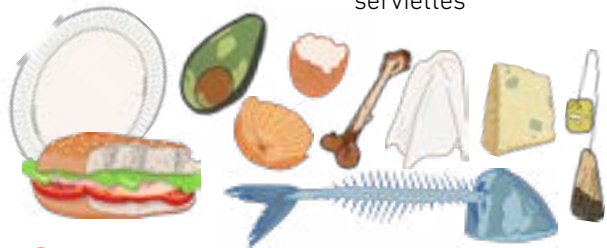
Food organics

The following items can be put in your food organics bag.

Please remove stickers from fruit.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Food scraps, including out of date, inedible food
- ✓ Peels, fruit and vegetables
- ✓ Meat, bones and seafood shells
- ✓ Dairy products including yoghurt
- ✓ Citrus, egg shells, tea bags and loose coffee grounds
- ✓ Tissues, paper towels, paper plates and serviettes



⊘ No

- ⊘ Coffee pods
- ⊘ Plastic
- ⊘ Containers
- ⊘ Cling wrap
- ⊘ Metal or foil



Glass recycling

Put lightly rinsed, empty glass bottles and jars into the bag loose.

Smaller lids can be kept on if the bottle is empty. Large jar lids can go into recycling.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Glass bottles including beer, wine and olive oil bottles
- ✓ Glass jars including pasta sauce and condiment jars
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars for medicine or toiletries



⊘ No

- ⊘ Plastic bags or plastic packaging
- ⊘ Drinking glasses and glass cookware
- ⊘ Light bulbs
- ⊘ Loose lids and bottle caps from bottles or jars
- ⊘ Corks, pumps, sprays or glass droppers
- ⊘ Crockery and ceramics



Mixed recycling

Put your recycling in the bag loose. Cardboard boxes must be flattened, bundled and placed directly in hutches.

Glass does not go in this bag. It now must go in the glass recycling bag.

- ✓ Newspapers and magazines
- ✓ Paper and cardboard
- ✓ Steel cans and aerosols
- ✓ Aluminium
- ✓ Rigid plastics (preferably rinsed)



⊘ No

- ⊘ Clothing, shoes, textiles
- ⊘ Coated or waxed cardboard
- ⊘ Electronic waste and batteries
- ⊘ Tissues and paper towel
- ⊘ Glass, crockery
- ⊘ Plastic bags, other soft plastics
- ⊘ Polystyrene



General rubbish

The following items can be put in your general rubbish bag.

Food waste no longer goes in this bag.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Soft/flexible plastics and plastic bags
- ✓ Single-use items
- ✓ Nappies, wet wipes
- ✓ Broken glassware and crockery (wrapped for safety)

- ⊘ Paper and cardboard
- ⊘ Food waste

- ⊘ Flammables
- ⊘ Liquids: cooking or chemical
